This Conference demands the return of funds from unused UDAs back into the dental budget, allowing dentists to improve the oral health of more patients.



Motion 21

Conference demands that the DH and the GDPC address the major flaws within the recently published commissioning guides including lack of consultant and specialist availability together with under-funded services, and seek a solution immediately.
